

M/s L&T Emerged as L1.The Tender had been cancelled on 04.03.2020 due to anticipated delay in accord of CCEA approval of the Project and the process of e-tendering with reverse auction is in progress. Fresh NIT has been floated.

HM Package (Lot II)

Tender documents for Lot II HM package was issued on 27.10.2017 with last date of submission on 07.12.2018. Technical Bids received were opened on 07.12.2018. The Offline tender for Lot II HM Package was cancelled on 26/08/2019 and the bidders were informed for the same. Process of e-tendering work is in progress.

E&M Package (Lot III)

Tender documents for Lot III EM Package was issued on 30.10.2017 with last date of submission on 27.08.2019. The Offline tender for Lot III EM Package was cancelled on 26/08/2019. Process of e-tendering work is in progress.



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#### 3. Status of Land Acquisition

Final Award for Land Acquisition has been issued by Collector Land Acquisition, Kishtwar on 22/03/2018 and accordingly Rs 24.35 crores have been placed at the disposal of Collector Land Acquisition, Kishtwar for disbursement to the land owners, out of which Rs 18.835 Crores has been disbursed to the land owners/adjusted against payment of State land till date.
