#### Pakal Dul Hydroelectric Project (1000MW)

### 1. Brief Introduction of Project

Pakal Dul (1000MW) HE Project was initially conceived by NHPC and later on got transferred to Chenab Valley Power Projects [P] Limited (CVPPPL). CVPPPL is a Joint Venture Company of NHPC Limited, JKSPDC and PTC (India) Limited incorporated on 13/06/2011; presently, entrusted for execution of 04 Hydroelectric Projects namely Pakal Dul, Kirthai-II, Kiru and Kwar with aggregate installed capacity of 3094 MW at Chenab River Basin in Distt Kishtwar of Jammu & Kashmir, with equity participation of 49%, 49% and 2% by NHPC, JKSPDC & PTC respectively.

Pakal Dul HE Project is proposed on river Marusudar, a tributary of Chenab in district Kishtwar of J&K. The project envisages construction of a 167 m high Dam, 2 nos. of Head Race Tunnel of 7.20M diameter and 10 km length, an underground Power House with 4 units of 250 MW each. The annual energy generation will be 3330 MU.

NOC from mining department has been obtained on dated 23.02.2017.

R&R Plan

The J&K govt. has approved the Rehabilitation and Resettlement plan of the project vide Govt. Order dated 22.02.2017 and 07.03.2019, total payment of Rs 49.09 Cr has been released as on date in favour of Commissioner Rehabilitation and Resettlement, Pakal Dul HEP (DC Kishtwar) for implementation of RR Plan.

Disbursement of RR benefits is in progress and a payment of Rs 43.03 Crores to Project Affected Families (PAFs) has been made so far.

### 3. Status of Private Land Acquisition

Final awards for acquisition of Power House area land and Reservoir area land have been accorded. A total amount of Rs 99.84 Crores as per final awards of land acquisition amounting to Rs. 99.84 Cr. issued to the Project till date has already been deposited with the concerned Collectorate for further disbursement to landowners.

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### 4. Status of Tender/Award

The Hon'ble High Court of J&K pronounced its judgement on **28.01.2017** in favour of CVPP Ltd. wherein cancellation of tenders was upheld. Accordingly, tendering process on Package mode for the Project was taken up in following packages of major works and the present status of the tenders and awarded works is as under:

#### Dam Package

Dam Package awarded to M/s Jai Prakash Associates Ltd on 21.06.2018 along with Diversion Tunnel and HRT from upstream side. The site has been handed over to M/s Jaiprakash Associates Ltd. The Contractor has started the site mobilization and infrastructure works. The status of construction works is as-

#### **Diversion Tunnel:**

Excavation of Diversion Tunnel Heading and Benching has been completed on **27.11.2020**.Invert concreting lining first layer progress: 827 m achieved out of total length 851 m. Overt concreting lining progress: 582 m achieved out of total length 851 m. Overt lining is being done by using two Gantry of 12m length each. 1st and 2nd Stage embedded parts have been fixed upto EL 1555m and 2nd stage concreting is in progress.

#### **Excavation of HRT Adits:**

Portal development works for Adlt to HRT has been completed. Excavation work of Adit 1 to HRT-2 has been completed and reached into HRT-2 on 18.03.2020. The cumulative progress of Adit-I A to HRT-1 is 517 m out of total length of 698 m. The cumulative progress of Excavation of HRT-2 is 575.5 m, out of total length of 2086. 708 m and Excavation of HRT-1 is 165 m, out of total length of 2034.48m.

#### Intake Gate Platform:

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Drain work and PCC work in berm at EL 1740 m are completed for 100% length. Excavation for 2nd bench up to EL 1721 and third bench up to El 1706 m is in progress leaving benches for slope protection work. Further, Reinforcement fixing and binding is in progress.

#### **Tunnel Spillway:**

Tunnel Spillway Gate Shaft Platform: Excavation below EL 1709 m is in progress and Wire mess fixing is in progress from EL 1714 m to 1710 m .Excavation work is in progress at El 1703 m. Approach road works to Outlet Tunnel Spillway is in progress and out of 240 m length of road formation cutting of 158m length has been completed. Tunnel Spillway Outlet: Excavation of Overburden is done from EL.1652 m to EL 1612 m. Wire mesh work above EL1612m has been completed up to 50 m length. Excavation of hard rock in progress from EL 1616 m to EL 1611m.

### Surface Spillway:

Excavation completed for first bench at El 1738m up to section 11-11. Further Excavation for first bench from section 11-11 to 15-15 is in progress. Excavation for next bench at El 1723 is under progress, has reached upto El 1730 between section 1-1 to 11-11 in D/s side and to 23-23 in U/s side. Slope Protection above El 1738 m is under progress in between section 12-12 to 15-15.
