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At the outset, Addl. PCCF & Nodal Officer(FC) welcomed all the officers and briefed about the objective of the meeting. After detailed discussions, following decisions were taken:

- 1. Revision of CAT Plan of Kiru (624MW), Kwar (540MW) and Kirthai-II(930MW): The Baseline data pertaining to catchment area of all the Projects shall be prepared meticulously and consultation with the concerned Stakeholders shall be done to understand their requirements. Accordingly, interventions shall be proposed in the catchment area for conservation of soil & moisture, management of water regime and rejuvenation of the degraded eco system.
- 2. 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Preface/Acknowledgement

Socio-economic growth and development of any region is dependent on the skills and knowledge possessed by the people of that region act as driving forces to achieve the goals. The employability of persons, having better skills and knowledge, get better opportunities in life which also enables them to face the challenges posed by world. Kishtwar region of J&K (UT), has been the focus of hydro electric energy production. Kwar H E project is the new project which has been envisaged in the region. The socio-economic impacts caused by such projects pose problems for the affected families with special reference to displacement and losing movable and immovable assets along with their livelihood. In such situations rehabilitation of the locals is the priority for the proponents. It becomes necessary for the project authoties to identify opportunities especially job opportunities, directly or indirectly related with the project. There is dire need to also identify persons possessing some skills, qualifications, etc., who can be hired as skilled workers. The opportunities can also be identified for those who are without special skills and can be employed as unskilled workers. Thus, while giving the environmental clearance of Kwar H. E. Project, MoEFCC, New Delhi, in the R&R policy, has specified that the project affected families be mapped for their skills which includes identification of specific skills, knowledge and abilities possessed by the people in a specific trade, profession or job position, so as to develop a plan for their skill enhancement, enabling the Project Affected Persons to find suitable job opportunities in order to earn their livelihood.

To assess the present status of skills possessed by the PAPs of the Kwar H. E. Project, CVPP entrusted work of skill mapping and skill development plan to University of Jammu, Jammu, vide work order no. CVPP/KK/M(C&P)/2017/513 dated 15/09/2017. A performa has been devised to collect the above mentioned information by carrying out door to door survey of the Project Affected Families (PAFs) of the Kwar HEP (as per the revenue record). Based on the survey and personal interaction with the various Govt. departments of the area, skill development plan has been proposed and presented in the following pages. The major challenges of skill development initiative is also to address the needs of the PAP's by providing or improving their skills in order to enhace employability to secure a decent work,

increasing the capacity and capability of existing system to ensure equitable access to all, promoting life long learning, maintaining quality and relevance according to changing requirements particularly due to emerging economy, increasing participation of stakeholders, mobilizing adequate investment for financing skill development, attaining sustainability by strengthening physical and intellectual resources, etc.

SUMMARY

Development, rather sustainable development, is must for the economic growth of a nation that is to meet the environmental, economic and social needs of the people in a judicious way. It is the mode to achieve an increased standard of living, greater equity to improve the health, income and overall wellbeing of the people by ensuring sustainable use of environment and natural resources, and a net gain or equilibrium among human, natural, and economic resources to support future generations, are the basic concepts of sustainable development.

Development results in Economic, social and environmental changes which should be actually aimed to bring about positive change. It can lead to conflicts if we only concentrate on main development thrust for increased well-being and not taking into consideration the adverse social or environmental impacts. The need to avoid adverse impacts and to ensure long term benefits led to the concept of sustainability. Attaining sustainability requires addressing many fundamental issues at local, regional, and global levels, and achieving the goals and objectives of sustainability presents a great challenge for all segments of society. The priority has to be given to create a social system which provides solutions or provide opportunity to mitigate the negative impacts and enhance positive impacts.

India has faced the challenges on the path to development. To grow economically it has to consume energy and at the same time has to mitigate carbon emissions. Energy is an important input in domestic as well as commercial sectors as nearly every product and service in the economy supporting economic activities across each of its productive sectors require energy. Energy sector is also an important economic sector that creates jobs by extracting, transforming and distributing energy goods and services throughout the economy. The hydro electric is the major renewable energy producing sector but in turn also cause adverse impacts on the people in the form of their displacement, loss of movable and immovable assets, loss of livelihood, etc. and pose a great challenge for rehabilitation of the affected people.

With increased competitiveness, characterized by the shortage of human resources, every company/firm works with an objective to use the available human resources judiciously and in a best possible way. Thus, there has always been a demand for skilled workers over the

years due to increase in highly skilled and knowledge-based jobs. In case of Kwar H. E. Project, while giving the environmental clearance, MoEFCC, New Delhi, in the R&R plan, has specified that the project affected families be mapped for their skills, which includes identification of specific skills, knowledge and abilities possessed by the human beings in a specific trade, profession, or job position and a proposal is to be formulated regarding their skill enhancement so as to enable these PAPs to find suitable opportunities to earn their livelihood.

In order to identify the human resources with skill or having special capabilities, the present survey for skill mapping has been undertaken among the Project Affected Families (PAFs) of the Kwar H.E. Project, which has been made mandatory as per the Environment clearance letter no. J-12011/4/2010-|IA.I dated 10.04.2017 where in at serial no.(xiv) of specific conditions, following condition has been stipulated:

"Skill mapping of the area to be conducted, with emphasis on mentioning the skills inherent of the local people, skill requirement of the project and best ways to develop the skills in the local people so that the locals can be employed in the project"

In this regard, as per the work order no. CVPP/Kwar/Manager(C)/2017/24 dated 04/10/2017, the scope of the work was defined as follows

- a) PAPs with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings
- b) PAPs with some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training.
- c) PAPs who are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training.
- d) PAPs who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training.
- e) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services.
- f) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment.
- g) Specially abled PAPs and their special training requirements for skill development.

h) Marginalized PAPs and their special skill development requirements.

The data has been collected by carrying door to door survey of the PAFs of the Kwar HEP (as per the revenue record) regarding the skills possessed by the project affected persons of the PAFs as per the devised format. Compiled data revealed that 63 families (PAF's), comprising of 29 displaced and 34 non-displaced have 397 individuals (175 males and 222 females) with an average family size of 6.3 individuals.

In displaced families 18 PAPs have been identified with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings, 36 PAPs have some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training, 6 PAPs are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training, 7 PAPs are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training, 9 PAPs are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services, 50 PAPs are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment while no Specially abled PAPs has been reported from the PAFs. However, 29 families are falling under Marginalized PAPs

In non-displaced families, 24 PAPs have been identified with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings, 59 PAPs have some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training, 11 PAPs are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training, 11 PAPs are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training, 14 PAPs are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services, 60 PAPs are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment while no Specially abled PAPs has been reported from the PAFs. However, 34 families are falling under Marginalized PAPs.

Keeping in consideration the increasing job opportunities, directly or indirectly, in near future due to the various activities related to Kwar H.E. Project in the Chenab Valley following professions are expected to be created in the region which would require the skilled/unskilled resource. These can be:

Skill of the PAPs can be developed or their capabilities can be enhanced by giving training, through ITIs or in computer, typing or through Advanced Vocational Training Scheme or Apprentice Training under the Ministry of Labour and Employment in the field of Industrial, Medical, consumer electronics, process instrumentation, instrumentation, mechanics, cooks, automobile repairs, etc., depending upon their eligibility conditions for admission. The PAPs who are technically qualified such as diploma in engineering, computers, plumbing, electrician, medical assistants, having ITI training such as plumbers, carpenters, electricians, etc. The people having these reasonable qualifications can be engaged apperentices under Apperenticship Training Scheme (ATS) which is a Skill Development Scheme for youth of JK UT. This scheme has the provision to use training facilities of Public and Private sector industries for disseminating training to the individuals of the Project Affected families. The contractors of CVVPPL Hydel Project can provide such training tpo the Project Affecte Persons.

A large number of the persons belong to not educationally or technically qualified class. In this group, ladies with some aptitude in tailoring, embroidery, sewing, etc., which are already providing skilled services, can be provided with further hands-on training through short duration training courses. This can promote them to undertake self-employment in the field of knitting of woollens, embroidery, making of green carry bags, blanket making, etc. The males in this category are associated with activities ranging from masonry, plumbing, carpentry, blacksmith, drivers, mechanics, electrician, local artisans, etc.

Different vocational and hands on training in the various specialized fields can also be arranged for such people to enhance their capabilities by providing them training for self-employment. These trainings are being imparted in different sectors by various agencies in different districts of Jammu province. Various government departments such as agriculture, horticulture, Garden Parks and Floriculture, Animal Husbandry, Sheep Husbandry, Forest dept., etc are also providing various vocational training.

Chenab valley has the tourism potential and after development of the project better opportunities will be there for the locals to explore. The persons with appropriate trainings in tourism related activities can be instrumental in oveall tourism of the area and better trained people act as professional tourism service providers in the organized/un-organized sector. The Ministry of Tourism, Government of India, provides education, training and certification to the interested and eligible tourism service providers at every level.

Similarly, handicraft sector has a great potential for employment generation. There are different training centres of elementary/ advance nature in the state which are being operated by Department of Handicrafts. These trainings in the field will also help to generate self-employment in the region.

INTRODUCTION

To understand and maximize the potential of human resources, which is the most valuable and unique asset of an area/organization, it is important to know what skills are distributed throughout the existing human resource. This kind of knowledge allows decision-makers, to look at the resources available to them to meet the need of the organization/ area. Thus, skill mapping is an important and essential requirement for the development and uplifting of the existing human resource,. It will not only help to identify individuals who have the matching skills for doing the work but will also help to know the skills that will enhance the successful performance of the work. In fact, performance of any organization or development of any region depends upon the skills possessed by the people of that region as the production of any product or service depends upon the capabilities and efforts of human beings.

The present survey for skill mapping has been conducted in the Project Affected Families (PAFs) of the Kwar H.E. Project which has been made mandatory as per the Environment clearance letter no. J-12011/4/2010-|IA.I dated 10.04.2017 where in at serial no.(xiv) of **specific conditions**, following condition has been stipulated:

"Skill mapping of the area be got conducted, mentioning the skills inherent of the local people, and based on the skill mapping, the training to the youths be incorporated for their appropriate engagements in the Project."

In this regard, as per the work order no. CVPP/Kwar/Manager(C)/2017/24 dated 04/10/2017 (Annexure –I) the scope of the work was defined as follows

- a) PAPs with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings
- b) PAPs with some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training.
- c) PAPs who are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training.
- d) PAPs who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training.
- e) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services.
- f) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment.
- g) Specially abled PAPs and their special training requirements for skill development.
- h) Marginalized PAPs and their special skill development requirements.

The Kwar H.E. Project(540 MW) is a run of the river type development scheme across the Chenab River, in the State of Jammu and Kashmir near Padyarna Village in District Kishtwar. This site is approachable from Kishtwar by 28 km long motorable road on NH-1B (NH-44). Nearest rail head is Udhampur but main rail head and airport are located at Jammu. The proposed project is located between Kiru HE Project (upstream) and Dul Hasti HE Project (downstream), project dam site is located within a very steep gorge section on River Chenab. The project envisages the construction of a 195 m long and 101 m high concrete gravity dam above the river bed (109 m from deepest foundation level) across river Chenab with four number intakes, four pressure shafts, an underground powerhouse to accommodate 4 units of 135 MW each and two number tail race tunnel. The damming of the river will lead to the formation of a reservoir with a gross storage of 27.167 Mcum covering a submergence area of 0.8 Sq Km extending 6.7 km upstream of dam. Underground powerhouse is proposed on Right Bank of River Chenab near village Padyarna. The intake is located on the right bank of Chenab River, upstream of the dam axis. The water from the reservoir would be taken to powerhouse through pressure shafts/ penstocks and discharged through tail race tunnels (TRT) back into the river course. The left bank is steeply sloping with exposed rock mostly along the slope and is covered by thin overburden at lower elevations. For, execution of Kwar HE project about 138.21 ha of land will be acquired which will involves 14.80 ha of private land 93.66 ha of state land and 29.75 ha of forest land

As per the Socio-Economic survey, the study area of proposed Kwar H.E. Project is spread in tehsil of Nagseni (previously a part of Kishtwar tehsil and carved out of it after census 2011) of Kishtwar district. The villages where the families whose land and structures are likely to be affected by the proposed project activities have been categorized as affected villages. A total of 5 villages are going to be affected due to various project activities of proposed Kwar H. E. Project (Refer Table. 1), whereas, only families in four villages are being affected directly. The 5th village i.e. Galhar Bhata is losing only the Govt Land (riverbed land) and no families are being affected from this village. All the villages come under the jurisdiction of Nagseni tehsil of Kishtwar District. 63 PAFs with a total population of 350 out of which 44 are General Category and 19 Scheduled Tribe (ST) have been identified as affected families from 4 villages by the project authorities.

Out of 63 PAFs, 29 families are identified as displaced families due to loss of their houses. The displaced families belong to Bhagna village. This village will be affected by land acquisition for construction of project components, dumping area, quarry area and partially submergence area. The main village at higher altitude will not be submerged, however a few seasonal cattle sheds shall get submerged as their level is below the FRL (1385 m). A total of 29 PAFs are losing residential structures (houses), out of which 16 are also losing cattle sheds. Besides this a total of 7 PAFs are losing only cattlesheds and 5 PAFs are losing their kothas (seasonal cattle sheds). Among common property resources one graveyard is being affected in Bhagna village and three cremation ghats shall be affected in SemnaBhata, Ajna and Dichla villages accordingly.

As per Census of India 2011, the literacy rate in Jammu Kashmir is 56.35%. The literacy rate in the villages falling under study area is 67.96%, with 62.09% males and 37.91% females. Kishtwar Town has highest literacy rate of 86.07%. Male literacy rate is fairly high as compared to that of female literacy rate. In the project affected villages, Bhagna village has the highest literacy rate (57.79%) followed by village SemnaBhata (33.44%)amongst all the affected villages with male populations achieving greatereducational attainment than their female counterparts.

As per census 2011, 31.61% of the total population of study area is working population. Of this working population 59.08% are main workers and 40.92% are marginal workers. 68.38% of the total population of the study area population is considered as non-workers. However, in the project affected villages indicate that among the 4 affected villages, Bhagna has thehighest number of working population, whereas Dichla has the lowest number of working population. Altogether 29.71% people are engaged in some form of work. The proportion of workers engaged in cultivation is 7.32%, 1.59% are agricultural labours, 0.96% are in Household industries service and 90.13% are other workers. The list of household industries

includes those engaged in house-hold manufacturing, processing, repairing, servicing, etc., and that of other workers includes factory workers, plantation workers, those in trade, commerce, business, transport, mining, construction, political or social work, allgovernment servants, teachers, priests, artists, etc.

For providing the elementary education in the study area, due care is being given to the children attaining the age of 14 years and below under elementary education. Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) is in operation in all the villages and hamlets covering all the left out areas. There is one IGNOU study centre at Padyarna village. One Govt. Degree College, one B.Ed. College and a Kendriya Vidyalaya are situated at Kishtwar. Besides this, with an objective to propagate the higherstudies at public doorsteps, University of Jammu has recently established an offsite Campus atKishtwar. Four post graduate courses being run in the campus will cater to the needs of thestudents who after completion of their graduation used to seek admission in Universities of Jammu and Kashmir and in more cases to the universities outside the state. There is one higher secondary school at Bhagna village. For higher studies the students move to either Srinagar or Jammu.

Existing facilities within the Project Area

Educational facilities play an important role in the overall development of an area. These facilities enhance economic growth and employment. There are twelve schools in the area viz. Primary education facilities are available in all the four affected villages. The number of educational facilities are given below;

A district Hospital is located at Kishtwar. One medical sub centre/ dispensary is located at Padyarna village and one at SemnaBhata village. An ayurvedic centre is located at Padyarna. Apart from these, villagers also depend on Primary Health Centre located at Kiru.

- ➤ One sheep husbandary centre is located at Bhagna village.
- There is one veterinary sub centre at Padyarna (Hamlet of Revenue village Bhagna).
- ➤ The Anganwari centres are located in all the villages.
- The most important road in this area is Kishtwar-Paddar Road that runs through project area. The villages situated on right bank do not have any road connectivity and

- people haveto travel on foot to approach the nearest market places. Transport services in the region depend mainly on the Bus and private light vehicles.
- ➤ Branches of J&K Bank, J&K Gramin Bank, HDFC Bank, Co-operative Bank, Punjab NationalBank and State Bank of India are located at Kishtwar town and a branch of J&K Bank is located at Padyarna.
- ➤ Post office branches are available at Kishtwar and Paddar. There is a single branch of Post Office at Galhar, approximately 8 km upstream of project location.
- ➤ The telecommunication facilities are poor in the area. The mobile cellular network is however available in the study area.
- ➤ Maintaining law and order situation in the region is one of the primary functions of the Police Administration. To fulfill this purpose 1 police post exists at Padyarna in the project affected villages.
- Main water sources are springs (chasma) and water supply sourced from adjoining nallahs. The water supply schemes viz. Guminag to Padyarna, Chaichangal Nala to Draulah cover the left bank villages and water supply from Krond Nala, Yaar nala cover the right bank villages of Chenab River i.e. Ajna and SemnaBhata. Water supply in village Bhagna is met by Nai gad nallah. Nai gad nallah is also the main source of water supply to Kishtwar town. Whereas handpump facilities are also available in roadside villages. Mostly the locals depend upon conventional irrigation system.
- All the habitations in the project area are electrified, but the power supply is irregular having poor voltage. Villagers also use kerosene lamps and solar power for lightening.
- The most common toilet facility among the village households is the pit latrine. Few households have septic tank sanitary facility. The common practice of most of the villagers is to visit the open field for defecation. Fuel wood and kerosene is the dominant source of energy. Cooking gas is also used by some villagers.
- ➤ The major market places are located at Kishtwar and Paddar. There is a small market consisting of a few shops at Padyarna. Petrol pumps are located in the main Kishtwar town area.
- The fair price shops are located in all the villages. One Seed sub centre is located at Padyarna but the supply is very limited. A ropeway service is being constructed across the Chenab river, for goods supply from Padyarna to SemnaBhata.

Almost all District level Govt. Department offices are located at Kishtwar. Tehsil level offices are located at Padyarna. Tehsilder and Naib Tehsilder offices are located at Padyarna and Patharneki respectively.

METHODOLOGY

Detailed survey of all the project affected families of the Kwar H.E. Project, has been conducted initially in the year 2017-18 and was again collected and updated during 2021. Information related to skills possessed by project affected persons (PAPs) belonging to various Project affected families (PAFs) of the Kwar H.E. project, Kishtwar was collected by personal interaction (**Plate 1 and II**) with the help of a Performa (**Annexure – II**,).

- ➤ PAF's have been considered as per the revenue records which consisted of a total of 63 families constituting 29 families as displaced and only 34 as non displaced.
- ➤ Information on displaced and non-displaced families has been compiled separately. Information has also been categorised on the basis of sex, age groups, income group, educational and technical qualifications and profession/skill possessed by the PAPs.
- For working out various categories mentioned under scope of the study, following criteria for the identification of PAPs has been taken into consideration:
 - i) PAPs with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings: Under this scope all graduates and post graduated PAPs have been placed
 - ii) PAPs with some educational qualification and whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training: Under this class all PAPs having qualification of matric and 12th(pursuing UG) have been included.
 - iii) PAPs who are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training: Under this scope all PAPs having technical qualification such as B.Tech/M.Tech have been included.
 - iv) PAPs who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training: Under this class all PAPs having technical qualification such Diploma, etc in different trades have been included.
 - v) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified, but are already providing skilled services: Under this class, PAPs not having technical qualification and education but are providing some skill services like mechanics, carpenters, tailors, masons, etc have been included.

- vi) PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment: Under this scope all major (above 18 yrs) PAPs having qualification below matriculation have been included.
- vii) Specially abled PAPs and their special training requirements for skill development: Under this scope all Specially abled PAPs have been included
- **viii**) Marginalized PAPs and their special skill development requirements: Under this scope all Marginalized PAPs (AAY) have been included.
- The proofs of educational qualifications and experience certificates of the nominated members of PAFs was collected and are attached with this report.
- The various trades directly or indirectly associated with the project were identified in consultation with the officers of the CVPP. The due consultation was also carried out with district authorities, heads of various government departments and suggestions/were incorporated in the report.
- ➤ The information with regard to Trainings for agriculture related teckniques Krishi Vigyan Kendras of SKUAST –Jammu , Polytechnics and ITIs is included in the skill mapping report. .

Utility of the Report

- ➤ This report shall be useful for the District Administration, CVPP Ltd., and Contractors associated with the Kwar H. E. Project for getting the inputs regarding the existing skills in the PAPs of the above project for formulating action plan at their respective levels.
- ➤ It will be also useful for various Institutions / NGOs interested in initiating training programmes for skill development among the PAPs in particular and people of the Chenab valley in general. These agencies can design their own course curriculum taking inputs from the report.

SKILL MAPPING OF THE PAFS

Door to door survey has been carried out for mapping the educational status and various skill possessed by the Project Affected Persons (PAP's) of Kwar HEP. The Project Affected Families (PAF's) were further classified in two categories i.e., displaced and non-displaced families. The information compiled for these categories are presented in Table 1 (combined for displaced and non-displaced), whereas tables 1a and 1b separately for displaced and non-displaced families, respectively.

According to information collected there are 63 families in accordance to revenue records belonging to four villages falling under the jurisdiction of Kwar HE Project. The total 63PAF's, majority of the families are non-displaced (34) and only 29were displaced. These households comprise of 397 individuals with an average family size of 6.3 individuals and have 222 males and 175 females. Thus 63 families, 34 non-displaced and 29 displaced have been added to the 63 families recorded under RR Plan.

Regarding economic status of the PAF's, it has been observed that majority of the families are economical backward, comprising of 18 PAF's belonging to BPL and 9 families belonging to AAY category. Only 17 PAF's are found above poverty line (APL), while 6 families belonged to Non Priority House hold (NPHH) and 13 PAF's to Priority House hold (PHH) categories.

The individuals of the PAF's have been categorised into three age classes i.e., age less than 18 years, 18 to 38 years and above. Majority of the individuals are found to fall in the age group less than 18 years (129) followed by age group 18 to 38 years (111), 38 to 60 (123) while 34 individuals are found to fall in the age group of 60 and above.

The main occupation among PAF's is agriculture/farming/zamindari with 34 individuals directly engaged in this profession. Of the total females in the PAF's, 77 comprised of house wives. A total of 146 individuals are school / colleges going. The other profession to which the members of the PAF's are found engaged includes Government Jobs (8), Government teacher (12), Drivers (15), Masons (3), Tailors (2) and labourers (6). Among PAF's individuals are also found engaged in various Government run schemes such as MG-NREGA (1), Contractor (3), JCB Operator (2), Carpenter (2), Plumber (2), Operators

(2) Shopkeepers (2), Anganwadi worker (1), Cooks (2) and Social welfare workers (2). One individual each was found working as a Engineer, Assistant for excavation work, businessman, Dental Technician in NHPC, assistant in Kwar project, madrasa worker, medical assistant, medical officer, police constable, painter, dealer and a Trainee. Five persons belonging to PAFs are superannuated govt. employees.

The details of information collected with regards to the educational and technical qualifications possessed by the various individuals having skill or without skill in both categories of displaced and non-displaced is given in tables(2 ato e) and 3 (a to e) and discussed below.

A) DISPLACED FAMILIES

a. PAPs with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings: In this group only 18 individuals (11males and 7 female) have been identified, of which 10 are graduates and 2 post graduates. Of these 18 individuals, 7 of them are already employed in Govt. jobs while one male is an engineer and 8 are school going and 2 are housewives, one of the female found to possessed B.A., B.Ed degree (**Table 2a**).

b. PAPs with some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training:

The total of 36 PAPs were found to possess education qualification of matriculation or more, comprising of 23 males and 13 females.

Of the total of 36 PAPs, 20 individuals have already passed the matriculation examination,13 possess the qualification up to 12th standard whereas, 3 individuals possess qualifications up to 11th standard. Individuals having less than 18 yrs of age are 10, while 17 are between the age of 18 to 30 years, 5 are aged more than 30 while only 4 are of age more than 60. Among 36, 19 individuals are students, 5 are housewives, 2 are govt. teachers, rest other work as Zamindar (1), Driver(1), Plumber(1), Labour(1), Businessman(1), Contactor(1) and only 2 are Retd. Govt. employee (**Table 2b**).

c. PAPs who are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training (i.e. do not require any skill/vocational training):

A total of 6 individuals were identified, comprising of 5 are males while 1 are females, possessing the engineering degree and diploma as dental technician. Trade

efficiency of some of these technically qualified persons can be improved through some advance trainings (**Table 2c**).

d. PAPs who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training:

The 7 individuals in this group have been identified to have some professional or technical qualifications comprising of 6 males and 1 females. Of the total 6 males, 5 males have degree in engineering whereas, only one male is having diploma in civil engineering from polytechniccollege. The female has a diploma in dentistry (**Table 2d**).

e. PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services

A total of9 individuals, all male has been identified in this category who are not having any specific technical or higher educational qualification. These individuals are majorly engaged in activities like Zamindari (03) and asLabour (3). One individual each was found engaged as plumber (01), and Electrician cum Driver (01). Most of the individuals in this group are not well educated and comprise of 5 individuals are having qualifications upto 8th (Middle) whereas, 04 are illiterate.

The individuals in this group are although engaged in jobs mentioned above but their potential and capability can be enhanced by providing necessary training regarding modern technology and contemporary jobs (**Table 2e**).

f. PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment:

Majority of the individual (50) of the total of 174 individuals(minors excluded), do not possess the requisite educational or technical qualification. This category is represented by 21 are males while 29 are females. A total of 10 individuals belonging to this group are senior citizen. Every individual in this group is under matriculate.

g. Specially abled PAPs and their special training requirements for skill development

No specially abled person has been identified from the PAFs.

h. Marginalized PAPs and their special skill development requirements

A total of 29 families are falling under this category. Every individual belonging to this group have been covered under the above heads. However, emphasis will be given to these families.while finalizing the scope of different skill development programmes in the area.

B) NON-DISPLACED FAMILIES

a. PAPs with suitable educational qualification without skill development trainings:

This group comprises of 24 individuals (14 males and 10 females) out of which 9 individuals are graduate, 1 individual possess P.G., while, 4 individuals are engineer, 3 are medical students, 4 females are doing B.Sc. Nursing while 2 female individuals are having B.Ed. qualification. (**Table 3a**).

b. PAPs with some educational qualification whose skill can be upgraded with skill development training:

There are 59 PAPs in this category, comprising of 34 males and 25 females. Of total, 32individuals possess matriculation while, 19 individuals have passed the 12thstandard. Among these 22 are school going, 9 are Government employees, 3 are driver, 2 contractors, whereas, 6 are housewives and rest of PAPs are engaged as cook, craftsman, daily wager, operator and in MGNERGA represented by one PAP each (**Table 3b**).

c. PAPs who are technically qualified for various jobs without any skill development training (i.e. do not require any skill/vocational training):

There are 11PAPs (7 males &4 females) who are technically qualified for various jobs. Among 7 males, 2 individuals are having degree in engineering, while all other possess computer diploma but are engaged as craftsman (1), in MGNERGA (1) and rest are school going. Among females, 2 are having Nursing training, one is student with computer diploma and other is house wife having B.ed. degree (**Table 3c**). Trade efficiencyof these technically qualified persons can be improved through some training.

d. PAPs who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training:

There are 11 individuals (7 males &4 females) who are technically qualified to a level that can be upgraded to match the required skill for various jobs with skill development training as they already possess degrees in engineering and diploma in Nursing and computers, details of these are already discussed in section c of non-displaced families(**Table 3d**).

e. PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but are already providing skilled services

There is total14 individuals (13 males and 1 females) in this category. Out of these 13 males, 04 are driver while other are engaged as Zamindar (2), operator (2), carpenter (2), Shopkeeper (2), students (2) and one individual on Kwar project (**Table 3e**). These individuals are doing the jobs mentioned above but their capability can be enhanced by providing them necessary training regarding modern technology and contemporary jobs.

f. PAPs who are not educationally or technically qualified but can be trained for self-employment:

Majority of the individual (60), barring the minors, are those who don't have the essential education or technical qualification. Of these 17 are men while 42 are females all with qualification below matriculation. This group incorporate 14 individuals who are over the age of 60.

g. Specially abled PAPs and their special training requirements for skill development:

No eligible specially abled person has been reported from the PAFs.

h. Marginalized PAPs and their special skill development requirements

34 families are falling under this classification. Every one covered under the above head, should be given special emphasis while settling the extent of various ability improvement programs under this project.

PAPs with acceptable educational qualifications but no skill development training can be trained or their talents can be boosted by providing some incentives for them to enroll in skill development programmes such as computers, typing, and so on, and then act as trainers for others in the area. Postgraduates and graduates can work in schools as teachers, trainers, and so on. PAPs with the appropriate qualifications can also function as office superintendents, office accountants, and work supervisors in the project's offices.

PAPs with some educational qualifications whose skills can be upgraded with skill development training through ITIs or through the Ministry of Labour and Employment's Advanced Vocational Training Scheme or Apprentice Training in the fields of industrial, medical, consumer electronics, process instrumentation, instrumentation, mechanics, cooks, automobile repairs, and so on. Basic eligibility criteria/qualification criteria vary from course to course at various institutes/training institutions that provide professional training in courses.

However, the training in the ITI can be given to those who fulfill the basic eligibility conditions for admission (**Table-4**).

PAPs with technical skills, such as a diploma in engineering, computing, plumbing, electricity, or medical assisting, and who have some reasonable qualifications can work on project-related tasks or with contractors as such. Furthermore, by providing hands-on training or refining their skills to perform specialised activities, the employability of the above-mentioned PAPs can be further boosted. PAPs in this group who have some computer skills can work as computer assistants, computer data analysts, or data entry assistants in project offices. Plumbers, carpenters, electricians, and other tradespeople with ITI training are employable in project activities.

Short-term training courses can be provided to women who have some ability in tailoring, embroidery, sewing, and other related skills. This may encourage them to start their own business. PAPs who have been trained and have entrepreneurial abilities may be given incentives to invest in infrastructure and start their own training centres, allowing them to teach younger enthusiasts tailoring, stitching, and weaving skills.

Similarly, PAPs who are technically qualified to a certain level and whose efficiency can be improved to match the required skill for various jobs in the area by providing them with skill

development training, as discussed previously. PAPs with nursing qualifications can work as nursing assistants or medical assistants in the Dispensary.

PAPs who are not educationally or technically certified but already provide skilled services have been recognized in the projects. The females in this category are working in tailoring and related fields but lack sufficient training. These women's aptitude can be boosted by providing them with vocational training or a customized training course, if they are already working in the tailoring industry. Knitting woolens, needlework, producing green carry bags, and blanket making are all choices for such candidates. Males of this group are workingas mason, plumber, carpenter, blacksmith, driver, mechanic, electrician, and local artisans, among other things.

Majority of the PAPs belongs to the category, who do not have an educational or technical background, but their abilities can be boosted by providing them with self-employment training. Although there are no specific job opportunities for men and women in today's society, their abilities can be increased by providing them with vocational and hands-on training in a variety of specialist sectors.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMMES

Vocational trainings are being imparted in different fields by various agencies. List of the different traits in which trainings programmes are held is given in **Table 5**. These trainings are being given in different sectors having different modules by various agencies in different districts of Jammu province (**Table 6**). The list of the trainings being imparted in Doda and Kishtwar districts of Jammu province has been given in **Table 7**. Eligibility criteria, duration of the different traits and fee structure of the various courses has been in **Table 8**.

Agricultural related Vocational training can be provided by KVKs of SKUAST- J, various Government Departments such as agriculture, horticulture, Garden Parks and Floriculture, Animal Husbandry, Sheep Husbandry, Forest dept., etc. The trainings related to Beekeeping, Apiculture, Mushroom Cultivation, etc. can be provided by Agriculture Dept and KVKs of the Agriculture universities. The expertise related to growing of cut flowers on commercial basis can be imparted by Department of Floriculture, whereas the training related to agro-forestry, and tree plantation can be given by Forest Dept. The training pertaining to establishment of orchards and fruit cultivation including post-harvest processing can be imparted by dept. of Horticulture. These trainings could be provided through tailor-made, short-term programmes from the various departments. These trainings can be conducted for

trainees to provide technical skills as well as to increase the confidence of the enterprise's management in them.

Interaction with officials from the Department of Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Sheep Husbandry, Sericulture, DIC, Handlooms, Fisheries and Floriculture etc. held in the office of the Deputy Commissioner Kishtwar to get the feedback regarding the various skill development activities of the respective departments, following proposals/suggestion have been received.

- **a. Horticulture Department**: Department can provide six-month duration training course for development of skill related to food processing and canning of fruits and vegetables to unemployed youth having minimum age of 18 years with matriculation qualification. A proposal for undertaking training for youth related to training, pruning, top working, budding/ grafting of walnut, apple, etc. has also been submitted by the department (proposal enclosed as annexure **Annexure III).**
- **b. Sheep Husbandry Department**: Aprogramme with regard to imparting training for machine shearing, latest and modern technical knowhow with regard to sheep/ goat rearing practices and farm management training programmes can be provided by the department. Also, field visits of farmers to other states and within the state can be managed by the department (**Annexure IV**).
- c. Floriculture Department: Department has also proposed training programmes for Gardeners and farmers under commercial floriculture especially with regard to cut flowers, high valued flowers, aromatic crops and bulbous flowering plants (Annexure V).
- **d. Fishery Department**: Department can undertake training programmes with special reference to Trout fish (**Annexure VI**).

These programmes will not only lead to generate the employment but would also result in generation of additional income. List of Skilling Areas in Agriculture & Allied sectors where Vocational training can be imparted is also given in Table 9.

In this regard, the provision for establishing a Common Training Centre already exists under the R&R Plans of Kiru and Kwar HE Projects. This provision provides for "Infrastructure support for establishment of a common centre for providing Self Employment Training to PAFs in various fields like fruit and vegetable processing, apiculture, dairy farming, poultry farming, etc. through the Departments of Horticulture and Agriculture."

Regular training programmes / refresher programmes for PAPs can be organised in this Centre through the Extension Divisions of Agriculture Department, Horticulture Department, Veterinary Department, etc. for enhancing the self-employability skills of the PAPs on a long-term basis.

TOURISM /HOTELS/COMMUNICATION: CAPACITY BUILDING FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS (CBSP)

The tourism infrastructure relies heavily on well-trained human resources. Locals might be given training in tourism and hospitality-related industries to help increase the region's tourism potential. To provide improved service standards for client satisfaction, a considerable number of tourism service providers in the organized and unorganized sectors require basic training and certification. Simultaneously, there is a critical need to further upskill or expand the capacities of service providers who have previously been taught. These skilled service workers could be directly serving tourists or participating in crucial tasks such as education, administration, or planning.

The Ministry of Tourism, Government of India provides education, training and certification to the tourism service providers at every level through the CBSP Scheme to interested individuals of 18 years and above. The main objectives of trainings are to train and up-grade manpower at every stratum of service in order to i) capitalize on the vast tourism potential of the area, and ii) provide professional expertise to the local populace as well as create fresh opportunities for employment generation in the tourism sector both in urban as well as rural areas.

Following Training programmes for different categories of PAP's can be arranged:

- i. Skill Development in general for fresh candidates;
- ii. Specialized skill development, including language courses for fresh as well as existing service providers;
- iii. Training of teachers, administrators and planners;
- iv. Basic Skill up-gradation in general for existing service providers;
- v. Training of Trainers programmes;
- vi. Trainings for tourist guides
- vii. Trainings for specialized tourist activities like paragliding, water rafting, bird watching, trekking, rock climbing etc

Training should also cover the different aspects related to tourism likeHealth & Personal Hygiene, Cleanliness, Basic Service techniques, Cooking Techniques, Garbage Disposal, Etiquette and basic manners, basic nutrition values, Energy saving and nutrition saving techniques, Basic tourism awareness. Presentation and Communication skills, Behaviour Skills, First Aid, handling of accidents, Client Handling and Behaviour Skills, Sensitization to HIV/AIDS, Skill Development in general for fresh candidates, Specialized skill development, including language courses for fresh as well as existing service providers, awareness Programmes, Basic Skill up gradation in general for existing service providers, Tourist police training, Developing skills in product presentation in rural tourism etc.

Training Programmes will help to develop the Service providers likeBearers, Bartender, Cooks, stewards, Receptionists, Information Providers, Drivers, Govt. Staff who come in contact with tourists, Supervisors, Guides, Travel assistant, Manager for small Hotels, Baker & Confectioners, Catering staff, Meal Providers, Tour Escort/assistant, Reservation and ticketing assistant, House keeper, Event management supervisor, Hospital house keeper, Interior designer, Florist, Tourism Staff of Central and State Departments, Tourism facility Planners and management staff, Guides, Tourism facilitator/runner, Foreign language interpreters, Naturalists, rural artisans/craftsmen/entertainers, tourist police, teachers, administrators and planners etc. shall be covered under the training for developing their skill.

The "HUNAR SE ROZGAR TAK" scheme aims at skilling youth between 18-28 age groups with the prior focus on instilling employable skills. The minimum qualification for the certificate course is Middle standard. The placement assistance is also provided under the scheme. Different Training centers under the **Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY)** are involved in imparting the job ready skill sets to the youth of the region (web address of the PMKVY is pmkvyofficial.org/).

CRAFT WORK

Jammu and Kashmir is one of the states in India that is best known for its cultural heritage and rich craft which has prevailed since a very long time. The famous Basohli Qalam paintings which are kept only in famous museums across the world are found in Jammu and Kashmir. The vibrant culture of the state is also reflected in the paintings costumes and ornaments which are truly world class.

The arts and crafts of Jammu and Kashmir have recognition all over the world and everyone in the state is affiliated to this occupation in one way or another and is the major

economic sector of the state. Crafts in the state vary from the embroidery to shawl weaving, wood carving to papier machie, carpet weaving to namda weaving and much more.

Different handicraft items of the state include Carpets, Shawls, Paper Mache, Copper Ware, Jamwar or Kani Jami Shawl, Pashmina shawl, Namdas, Gabba, tweed, Willow Basket, Willow bats, Papier Mache boxes and Embroidered Pheran, Rugs and Small Artifacts Made from Exquisite Walnut Wood, Chain Stitch, Khatumbandh, Crewel and Wood Carving, leathers and furs and stone crafting etc.

Handicraft sector has a great potential for employment generation. In order to broaden the artisan base and to augment the human resource required in the industry, Department of Handicrafts is running 553 training centers of elementary/ advance nature in the state. The duration of advanced training course is of 2 years while as the duration in respect of elementary training course is one year. The department is providing stipend to each trainee per month in respect of advance and elementary training courses. Persons trained in these centers are being registered with the department under follow up mechanism enabling them to earn their livelihood.

SCOPE / PROVISIONS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

There is an urgent need to provide financial resources to PAPs so that they can start their own businesses and earn a living. Although training and skill development will provide them with work-ready skills, not all of them will be absorbed in project-related tasks. The trained PAPs will need startup cash and working capital to launch their own businesses. Many microfinance institutions in the region can help these PAPs get the funding they need to get their small businesses off the ground. There are specialized institutions for rural financing like Jammu Kashmir Grameen Bank which is providing agriculture and rural development schemes and kisan credit cards. Jammu Kashmir Entrepreneurship Development Institute (JKEDI) which has district offices in Doda as well Kishtwar can help in skilling and providing financial assistance to the PAPs. JKEDI maintains a strict surveillance on the project construction and evaluation with the help of highly professional staff. Funding of PAPs can be arranged under different schemes of National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD). Motivated youth can play a great role in the upliftment of PAFs. The creation of financial cooperatives and Self-Help Groups can be a feasible solution to their financial problems and for creating more livelihood option for these people.

Proponents of the project should include a mechanism for giving easy loans at subsidized rates to trained people who need seed money and working capital to start their own businesses.

Recommendations

The proposed Kwar Hydro Electric Project on river Chenab, Jammu and Kashmir (UT) is to be constructed near Padyarna Village in District Kishtwar. The region is underdeveloped because of its remoteness, limited road and telecommunications connectivity, lacking access to market and inadequate infrastructure and facilities. The people of the area are majorly dependent on agriculture and rearing of animals. The agriculture practices in the area are traditional and inefficient.

The present report has been produced with the mandate of skill mapping with prime objectives of identifying the families affected by the project, review the socio-economic profile of the PAPs, assess the project initiatives and impact on employment generation potential of the area and to assess and identify skills and opportunities required to be developed and aid in such employment generation among the Project Affected Families.

Our interventions focused on various measures/ potential ideas required to be pursued for enabling creation of employment. The report is based on information collected from both, primary survey and secondary sources. The surveys were undertaken by personally visiting affected families and asking them to identify and nominate only one family member to be considered for vocational/ skill development training. The details of these members are presented in Table 10, which includes name of the nominated member, his/ her qualification, option for trade in which they want training and our recommendation for the type of course / institutes, where the courses are available. The recommendations regarding identification of a member is strictly according to the options given by head of families. The skill plan aims to create a local ecosystem in the area and provide workers with opportunities closer to their homes.

It is also recommended that the vocational courses available closer to their homes such as Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs), vocational training opportunities available in the area, training programmes run by various state Government departments such as Agriculture, Horticulture, animal husbandary, handicrafts, etc. and also through Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs) of Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agriculture Sciences and Technology- Jammu. Another way of imparting vocational training to the identified PAPs is through tailor made courses deviced with the help of KVKs and various governmental departments.

The final decision to consider the type and duration of trainings, etc. and and any change in nomination of family member is the prerogative of the Commissioner $R\ R\ /$ District authorities / $G\ M\ Kwar\ HEP$.
